The Vicar's Letter

You do not need to know precisely what is happening, or exactly where it is all going. What you need is to recognize the possibilities and challenges offered by the present moment, and to embrace them with courage, faith, and hope.

I was sent the above last week by Mike Tiley, just as our world seemed to be falling apart, and I have found great strength from it. The temptation at these times is to collapse into a heap in the corner just praying for it all to be over. I have felt that several times over the past week or two.

If we are to defeat this virus and the situation it is drawing us into we have to look at the positive and draw the changes and unusualnesses around us into a new creativity. Last weekend we had great struggles to try and bring you some form of Mass on Sunday. Eventually we got there and in so doing have discovered new ways of communicating. Churches are holding Zoom serves, WhatsApp prayer meetings, Skype visits, live streaming on Facebook. We are seeing a whole new bunch of people willing and able to help, doing shopping, having a chat on the phone, waving across the street. Potentially there are a lot of brilliant things that can come out of this dreadful situation, some big and some small but all to be celebrated.

We always draw things back to scripture and I have been reflecting on where we are in the season. Coming up to Passion Sunday as we turn towards the story of Jesus' passion; his betrayal and death. Yet as we do so as people of faith we are drawn into that story and constantly encouraged to see past it, past all the disappointments, betrayals and horrors to that morning that is to come, in that garden when hope is born again as Mary Magdalen realises who she meets and declares him, "Rabboni" (Jn 20.16). That is where we are to look and to live, in the resurrection hope that brings healing and love into our lives.
