**LENT, HOLY WEEK AND EASTER:** The programme for Lent, Holy Week and Easter is now out and available at the information table at the west end of the church. There is also a sign up list for those interested in joining the Lent Group, 'Paul's Letters from Prison'. Please indicate if you would rather hold the course on Zoom or in person.

**STATIONS OF THE CROSS.** As part of our journeying in faith we will hold regular sessions on Monday evenings (7.30pm) through Lent when we walk the way of the cross with Jesus, from his trial to his execution. Come and join us for a 30 minute mediation of the way of salvation.

**LENT COURSE 2025**: Paul's Letters from Prison. After his imprisonment in Rome Paul wrote four significant letters to the churches which have been included in the New Testament canon. In our short course we will hear something of modern scholars thought behind the letters and then explore them together. You do not need any particular skills, just a desire to learn more.

Our first session will be on Thursday 6<sup>th</sup> March with the next four sessions being on the Tuesday 18<sup>th</sup>, 25<sup>th</sup> March; 1<sup>st</sup> & 8<sup>th</sup> April at 7.30pm. Depending on the wishes of the group these with be on Zoom. You can state your preference on the sign-up list you will find on the desk near the baptistry.

**DIGITAL ORDERS OF SERVICE** can be emailed to you during the week, allowing you to download the order onto your digital device (smartphone; tablet etc). This saves on paper and printing. If you would like to do this and don't yet receive the order of service digitally, please contact the parish office and Lesley will be very happy to add you to our list.

## **PARISH GIVING SCHEME:**

The PCC would like to improve the way we make our regular offering for the work of God in our parish. The Parish Giving Scheme (PGS) is a system run by the Church of England that helps to efficiently gather our financial support whilst arranging Gift Aid collection from HMRC. Rather than paying directly into the church account we pay our offering to PGS. It is collected from our account on the 1<sup>st</sup> of the month and paid into the church account on the 10<sup>th</sup> of the month. The Gift Aid (if eligible) is then paid into the church account a couple of days later. This allows us to keep completely up to date with our income stream rather than waiting to make Gift Aid applications to HMRC every three to six months. It is so simple to do. Just go on the website and follow the instructions.
