We follow the RSCM (Royal School of Church Music) planning liturgy guide which lists hymns according to the readings for the day. Mark selects the hymns from the list that we have in our books which best suit the liturgy for the day, insuring that we don't repeat too often then sends the list to the clergy team.

The team review and edit the choices to fit and reflect the topic of the sermon for the Sunday.

Please send your suggestions with the title (and tune if you know it) to Mark, for instance, Love divine, all loves excelling (tune Blaenwern). It may also be useful to include any dates when you know you won't be at church, so you don't miss your hymn!

**LADY CHAPEL UPDATE** - Sincere thanks to everyone who has supported the Lady Chapel Project so far. The project will restore the Chapel's accomplished and beautiful decoration and fabric, and create a welcoming, prayerful and high-quality space for St Peter's and our community.

We're now just £1,000 away from being able to carry out the basic scheme of work – restoring the wall paintings and the parquet and stone floor, reinstating the altar rails, conserving the stained glass, repairing and painting the walls and cleaning the ceiling.

But we're not stopping there! If we can raise more money we'd like to replace the radiators and build a large appropriate cupboard behind the door to address our critical storage needs. We're also exploring having the wonderful Edward Fellowes Prynne painting outside the office door conserved and reglazed to make it far more visible.

A number of funding applications have been submitted and are planned to support this. But it's certainly not too late to contribute, and every gift, whatever the size, will help. Payment can be made to St Peter's account with the reference 'Lady Chapel'. We are also looking for volunteers to assist in researching and communicating the Lady Chapel's rich history. 
