# LADY CHAPEL PROJECT

A Very Parfit Gentil Knight – Ralph Bertram Kite was an ordinary Edwardian Schoolboy, sent home from Tazmania to be educated in England. During his tragically short life he rose to command a company of the 52<sup>nd</sup> Light Infantry on the Somme. Having been awarded the Military Cross, he was mortally wounded, and after an agonising month in hospital in Le Treport, died in the presence of his heartbroken parents – the Revd. Bertram Kite, Vicar of St Peter's, and his wife. More about this fascinating and moving story can be discovered in A Very Parfit Gentil Knight, a biography of Ralph Bertram Kite by his great-nephew, Dr Simon Harris.
