Letter from the Vicar.

Hello from a very (and apparently unusually) sunny and bright Vancouver, British Columbia. As I write I am coming to the end of my first week at AROCHA, Brooksdale Conservation Centre, just outside Vancouver City. Well when I say just outside, that is by Canadian standards. To get into Vancouver from here by public transport (never an easy feat in the Americas, so dominated as they are by the car) takes about two and a half hours using two buses and the Skytrain, Vancouver's version of the underground.

Before I had arrived here I hadn't appreciated the distances involved. I knew I'd need to travel a bit but hadn't realised how much. We get so used to our small island we forget how big the planet is.

Being at AROCHA challenges perspectives. So far this week I've spent time with Canadians (obviously) Americans (surprisingly quite a few), Singaporeans, Indonesians and Germans. Next week more visitors will come. I have a contact coming who is Irish and has lived here since the late 70s. I'll be meeting indigenous Canadians and discussing their world view. When we engage with so many people from so many different parts of the world we are challenged by the way they see us and how the world can be viewed differently through their eyes.

A major part of Jesus' ministry was to challenge the received world view of the time. To encourage the people to review their understanding of their relationship with God, one that they had taken for granted and turned into an understanding that meant the Messiah would come and free them from the Roman occupiers. Jesus challenged them to see God not as an avenging warrior but as one who brings healing and wholeness to a broken world. As one who frees us to see the world through the eyes of God. One that makes us fools for Christ, fools in the eyes of the world but wise in the sight of angels. In Jesus God's message becomes one that is counter to the expectation of human kind, one that sees us all as equal before God. There is no one-upmanship in knowing God, in calling God our saviour. There is no supremacy only servanthood. This is God's desire for all people and all creation, that we should worship and in worshiping serve each other and understand each other as fellow travellers on the road of life.

Ealing Foodbank

In 2013, people from more than 40 Ealing churches saw the need for a foodbank in Ealing; today we still need church support to keep the work going.

2017/18 - Client numbers increased by 40%

The number of 3 day food parcels distributed by Ealing Foodbank has risen, from 5007 year ending July 2017, to 7021 in year ending 31 July 2018.

This is due to changes in our referral system (we offer support to clients for as long as needed, as long as they remain engaged with their referring agent); changes beyond our control (Universal Credit was rolled out in Ealing in March 2018); and to increased use over the school summer holiday (41 families fed, 14 of whom have not used the foodbank before).

Food donations lower than food given out

Food donations are increasing, but are not keeping up with food needs, and for the first time we are regularly buying food where we have shortages.

Harvest is an important time for food donations, last year we received 8.5 tonnes in 6 weeks and we hope for a bountiful harvest again this year. If your church is thinking of supporting Ealing Foodbank with food donations specifically this harvest, please contact

Remembrance

We are holding our traditional time of Remembrance for all of those who lost their lives in the World Wars and the conflicts since that time, on Sunday November 11th at the 10.00am Mass. This year it is especially poignant as we mark the centenary of the Armistice on November 11th 1918.

composed by Malcolm Archer for the 80th birthday celebrations of the Her Majesty The Queen at St Paul's Cathedral. The service will also be framed by movements from the contemporary French composer Philip Mabboux's trumpet concerto.

In the evening at 5.00pm there will be a concert marking the Centenary of the Armistice with readings and organ music for 'Four Hands and Feet.' This is a specially arranged version of the Verdi Requiem for two organists and a Soprano voice. The readings will be themed on war, peace, loss and love.

The arranger of the piece, Alberto Brigandi is joined by our own Mark James and Vix Sherliker to perform the music.

Tickets are priced at $\pounds 10$ and there will be a glass of wine afterwards so that we can meet the performers and have a short time of fellowship.


Memorial Service – Sunday 4th November
