It aims to help every local church create a place where people can explore the Christian faith together and see how it can be lived out each day. Pilgrim takes a different approach to other Christian programmes. It approaches the great issues of faith not through persuasion, but participation in a pattern of contemplation and discussion with a group of fellow travellers.Pilgrim is comprised of two stages: the Follow stage for those very new to faith, and the Grow stage for those who want to go further.
